Academic Paper Sessions (Days 2 & 3)

The Academic Paper Sessions are at the heart of the APMAA Annual Conferences, showcasing members' research and encouraging meaningful exchanges with international peers. Since 2010, APMAA has implemented a discussant system, and since 2013, we have utilized the Microsoft Conference Management Toolkit (MS-CMT) to enhance transparency in the submission and review process.

This year, we received over 72 submissions to the Academic Paper Sessions. Thanks to the dedicated work of 65 reviewers worldwide, 53 papers were selected for presentation. Each was evaluated in line with APMAA's *Guideline for Authors* and with careful attention to academic rigor. This spirit of collaboration reflects the core mission APMAA has pursued for decades. While not all submissions could be accepted, all authors received constructive feedback to support the development and improvement of their research.

The program comprises 20 parallel sessions spanning two days, with each session featuring three presentations. Presentations will follow the format of 20 minutes for delivery, 10 minutes for discussion, and 5 minutes for Q&A, ensuring ample time for engagement.

Doctoral Colloquium (Day 1)

The Doctoral Colloquium will provide young scholars with valuable opportunities to present their research, receive constructive feedback from mentors, and connect with international academics. We accepted eight manuscripts from 15 submissions.

Academic Paper Sessions Schedule

(20 min. Presentation, 10 min. Discussion, and 5 min. Q&A per paper)

Instructions for the 2025 Academic Paper Session

Session Format

Each session has 2-3 papers. For each paper, the time is divided as follows:

20 minutes for the paper presentation

10 minutes for discussion

5 minutes for Q&A

Key Dates

October 1: Presenters must send their full-length papers to all session members.

October 5: All session participants must have shared their full-length papers.

Mid-October: All session participants are required to attend the online rehearsal.

One week before the conference, all presenters and discussants must share their final slides with all session participants.

Responsibilities

Moderators

As a moderator, you are fully responsible for coordinating your assigned session.

- -Become thoroughly familiar with all the papers in your session.
- -Ensure all session participants share their full-length papers and slides by the deadlines above.
- -Confirm that all session participants attend the online rehearsal.
- -Regularly update the APMAA Chair on your session's preparation progress.
- -In the event of a no-show, be prepared to step in as a presenter or discussant, using the provided slides to lead the session.

Presenters

You have 20 minutes for your presentation.

- -Send your full paper to all session members by **October 1**.
- -Prepare 10-20 slides and send them to all session members at least one week before the conference.
- -Promptly share any slide updates with your session members.

Discussants

You have 10 minutes for your discussion.

- -Prepare 7-10 slides outlining your key discussion points.
- -Send your slides to all session members at least one week before the conference.

Slide Design Tips

When creating your slides, please consider the viewer's perspective.

- -Use a font size of **20 points or larger**.
- -Avoid excessive text.
- -Use simple, easy-to-understand figures and tables.

The Moderator

As an **Academic Paper Session moderator**, your central role is to provide organization and cohesion to the session assigned. <u>You should be familiar with all papers to be presented in your session</u>. The duties of the moderator include the following:

- 1. Before the Conference, contact the presenting authors and discussants in your assigned session and provide information on session structure (time limits, presentation order, etc.). Request them to provide you with any updates, including changes in affiliation or changes to the paper's author. Also, the authors should be requested to send their papers to the discussants if they have undergone significant revisions.
- 2. Arrive at the session before the session begins. Identify the paper presenters and discussants in advance, and introduce yourself. Remind each presenter of the time limits that apply, and describe the method you will use to alert them of time limits during the actual Presentation.
- 3. At the start of the session, introduce yourself to the audience, announce the session/title, and offer a brief overview of the session structure. How many papers will be presented, how much time will each presenting author have for the presentation, when will the discussants provide comments, and when will the audience have the opportunity to ask questions or provide comments?
- 4. During the presentations, enforce time limits strictly so that no author (or audience) monopolizes someone else's time. Please ensure that the session finishes on time. Sessions that overrun will affect the following sessions.
- 5. If an assigned discussant is a **no-show**, the moderator must fill in and provide some comments on the paper. If a paper presenter is unexpectedly absent, the moderator should exercise judgment by allowing extra time for the other papers or dismissing the session early.
- 6. Organize the session's online rehearsal two weeks before the conference date. This trial ensures members of your session perform their roles well at the APMAA 2025.

The Discussant

The duties of an **Academic Paper Sessions discussant** include the following:

- 1. Read an assigned paper carefully and come prepared to comment (in PPT slides) on the paper. Each **discussant** has a 10-minute slot for his/her discussion. We recommend that the discussant prepare 7-10 PPT slides to convey the discussion points.
- 2. A discussant should spend his/her time stimulating the audience's interest in the subject and the papers. Preparation and attentiveness during the session are keys to successfully serving the discussant's role.
- 3. A discussant should limit his/her remarks to the allocated time so that ample time is left for audience participation.
- 4. Participate in online rehearsals scheduled two weeks before the conference date.




