

Prof. Dr. Emeritus Susumu UenoChair of the Board of Directors, APMAA
Professor Emeritus, Konan University, Japan

He is the Chair of the Board of Directors of the Asia-Pacific Management Accounting Association (APMAA) and Chief Editor of the Asia Pacific Management Accounting Journal. He previously served as APMAA President (2010–2013) and held major leadership roles in the Japanese Association of Management Accounting, including Vice President and Editor-in-Chief. In 2014, he received JAMA's prestigious Special Award for his exceptional contributions to management accounting research and education. A Professor Emeritus at Konan University, he has authored several influential books and published widely in international journals. He holds an MBA from the University of Maryland and a DBA from Southern Illinois University.



Prof. Emeritus Dr. Normah OmarBoard of Directors, APMAA
Professor Emeritus, ARI, Universiti Teknologi MARA, Malaysia

She is the first woman to be conferred the title of Emeritus Professor by UiTM, is a pioneering scholar in Islamic Financial Criminology. She has earned major international awards, including the 2020 Womani Award (1st place) and the 2019 GIFA Lifetime Achievement Award. As Director of the Accounting Research Institute (ARI), she elevated it to a Hi-CoE in Islamic Finance. Widely recognised for her influential research and global consultancy, she has played a key role in positioning Malaysia as a hub for Islamic finance. She continues to mentor numerous academics and contribute actively to advancing the field.



Prof. Dr. Shahzad Uddin

Professor of Accounting, Essex Business School, University of Essex, UK

He is a Professor of Accounting at Essex Business School and Director of the Centre for Accountability and Global Development at the University of Essex. He is the founding editor of the Journal of Accounting in Emerging Economies (JAEE). In recognition of his pioneering work, he received the British Accounting and Finance Association's Distinguished Academic Award in 2022. His research examines how accounting functions as a social and political practice studying themes such as labour control, governance, sustainability, and development across Asia, Africa, and the Middle East. In 2024, he was awarded Fellowship of the Academy of Social Sciences for his significant contributions to the field.



Prof. Dr. Md Shahinul AlamVice-Chancellor, Bangladesh Medical University

Prof. Dr. Md Shahinul Alam is a Professor of Hepatology and the Vice-Chancellor of Bangladesh Medical University. He holds an FCPS in Medicine and an MD in Hepatology, and has established himself as one of the leading clinical researchers in liver disease in South Asia. His research primarily focuses on nonalcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD/MAFLD), viral hepatitis, cirrhosis, and liver-related metabolic disorders. Prof. Alam has authored more than 170 scientific publications, with over 3,000 citations, and his work appears in prominent international journals in hepatology, gastroenterology, and internal medicine. His scholarly contributions have earned multiple international recognitions, including Young Investigator Awards and Travel Bursaries from APASL and AASLD. He actively supervises postgraduate research and contributes to academic development through curriculum design, editorial work, and scientific review.



Prof. Dr. Masumi NakashimaProfessor of Accountancy, Bunkyo Gakuin University, Japan Board of Directors, APMAA

Prof. Masumi Nakashima is a professor of accountancy at Bunkyo Gakuin University and Associate Dean of Graduate School of Bunkyo Gakuin, Japan. She holds a Ph.D. and MBA from Nanzan University in Japan. Dr. Nakashima is an active researcher in the area of earnings management, fraud, forensic accounting and corporate governance. She has published in journals including Managerial Auding Journal, Journal of Forensic and Investigate Accounting, and Research on Professional Responsibility and Ethics in Accounting.



Prof. Dr. Mosaddak Ahmed ChowdhuryProfessor, Department of Business Administration,
Shahjalal University of Science and Technology, Sylhet, Bangladesh

He is a distinguished academic and entrepreneur who have been delivering his service as a Professor in the Department of Business Administration at Shahjalal University of Science and Technology in Sylhet, Bangladesh. His research interests encompass strategic marketing management, entrepreneurship development, the Fourth Industrial Revolution, and Small and Medium Enterprises. Dr. Chowdhury published research articles in national and international journals extensively on topics such as microfinance, SME policy, and the role of information and communication technology in business performance. Beyond academia, he is actively involved in various organizations such as the founder President of the Asia Small Business Federation, Country Director of iTrain Asia, Bangladesh, Chairman of Rescue Aid Trust (UK), Bangladesh.



Prof. Dr. Syed Abdul HamidInstitute of Health Economics, University of Dhaka

He is a Professor at the Institute of Health Economics, University of Dhaka, where he also served as Director from 2016 to 2019. He holds a PhD in Economics from the University of Sheffield and an MSc in Health Economics from the University of York. Dr. Hamid has contributed extensively to health economics research, including studies on equity in health, gender inequities, health financing, and health services for Rohingya GBV survivors. His publications include works in the Oxford Encyclopedia of Health Economics and the Journal of International Development. He serves as a member of the Institutional Review Board at IHE and leads multiple funded research projects, such as social health insurance for public servants and the economic burden of dengue in Bangladesh.

Dr. Farhana is an accomplished academic, researcher, and leader in the field of accounting and management. She received a research grant from the Institute of Management Accountants (IMA), USA, and a Merit Scholarship for Postdoctoral Research from the Islamic Development Bank (IsDB). In addition, Dr. Farhana was honoured with the Womani 2022 – Most Influential Woman in Islamic Business and Finance award by Cambridge IFA (UK), recognizing her outstanding contributions as a professional, researcher, and author. Dr. Farhana has extensive experience in graduate and postgraduate teaching, as well as supervising research at Jagannath University, Bangladesh, in the Dept. of AIS. She has been actively engaged in scholarly research and has published numerous articles and book chapters. Her work has appeared in leading international journals, Sustainability, International Journal of Health Planning and Management, Frontiers, Journal of Health, Population and Nutrition, ABDC, Emerald Insight, Wiley, Springer Nature, MDPI, and PLOS ONE etc.
